Western Australia Forecast

Issued at 4:30 pm WST on Saturday 21 April 2018  
for the period until midnight WST Wednesday 25 April 2018.

Weather Situation - Northern Western Australia

A broad trough lies from the west Kimberley and across the coastal Pilbara, with little change to the pattern over the next few days.

Weather Situation - Southern and Central Western Australia

A strengthening northwesterly flow covers the southwest of the state, with a strong cold front expected to mover over the south of the state during Sunday. Strong and gusty winds are expected with the passage of the front, with moderate to heavy falls about the southwest of the state. A weakening westerly air stream will remain in the wake of the front on Monday, with a ridge of high pressure developing from the west on Tuesday. A high pressure centre is expected to move into the western Bight later on Wednesday.

Forecast for the rest of Saturday 21 April

Showers and possible thunderstorms throughout the southern half of the state south of a line Shark Bay to Mount Magnet to Giles. Moderate falls possible over the Southwest District.

Forecast for Sunday 22 April

Showers and thunderstorms over the South West Land Division, with moderate to heavy falls possible over the South West and southern Lower West districts. Strong squalls possible with thunderstorms south of a line Bunbury to Albany. Showers and thunderstorms over the remainder of the southern half of the state, extending into the northeast Gascoyne, far southeast Pilbara and adjacent northern Interior in the afternoon.

Forecast for Monday 23 April

Showers southwest of a line Shark Bay to Ravensthorpe contracting to the south coast during the morning. Showers and thunderstorms possible over the eastern Goldfields, the Eucla and South Interior with light patchy falls anticipated.

Forecast for Tuesday 24 April

Showers over southern coastal districts of the South West Land Division, contracting to coastal parts between Cape Naturaliste and Albany during the morning. Showers and thunderstorms over the South Interior and southeast Pilbara with light patchy falls anticipated.

Forecast for Wednesday 25 April

Showers over southern coastal districts of the South West Land Division. Showers and thunderstorms about the central Interior, northeast Gascoyne and southeast Pilbara. Isolated afternoon showers and thunderstorms about the far northwest Kimberley.

The next routine forecast will be issued at 4:45 am WST Sunday.
